



September at Lot 101

Moving into the first month of spring, the farm is beginning to see a transformation. Colour begins to speckle the landscape, slowly liberating the site from winter's grasp. Delicate flowers and soft leaves will begin to showcase on the menu, as winter crops begin to wane for another year.

Planting status

With winter frosts being held at bay by longer days and warm westerlies, we have been confident to start planting more delicate spring herbs and lettuce. Expect leaves like salanova, wasabina and red selway to grace the menu with colour and flavour.

We are also beginning to harvest tender brassicas as the surge of sunlight and warmth encourages romanesco heads and broccolini and spigarello.

Ready to harvest

We are seeing a strong start to spring with the early heat encouraging a lot of new growth. We are very excited to showcase our first asparagus harvest after a few years of cultivating crown growth on the perennial.

The warmth will also see many crops that have idled in the colder months, begin to reach readiness very quickly. Celtuce, baby fennel, and chard wait in the wings, read for their moment to showcase on our menu.

Community contributions

We are very fortunate for the community who help support what we do. We have just had an amazing harvest of citrus to get creative with, while heritage breed pigs from the Kanimbla Valley funnel through our wood-fired oven and curing cabinet.
